**1.      GENERAL DISCUSSION ON TRAFFIC ISSUES AND CHALLENGES  
FACING THE CITY**

Traffic Commission Chair James Coupe provided a report on the traffic issues that the Commission has been working on.

The City Council and Traffic Advisory Commission discussed the following issues:

- Stop signs
- Traffic on Los Robles
- Safe Route to Schools Grant
- Elevated crosswalks
- Lorain/Virginia intersection
- Upgrades to school signs

Councilman Steven Huang expressed his appreciation to the Traffic Advisory Commission for their service.

Commissioner Wendy Doo thanked the residents for attending the Traffic Commission meetings.

Dr. Roumani, San Marino, spoke on the MTA meeting regarding changes to bus route transportation and commented that the busses that travel through Oak Knoll have negatively increased activity on the street.

Dale Pederson, San Marino, commented that too many signs in the City can be a blight, and stated that the new stop signs on Virginia Road are very large. Mr. Pederson also commented on an increase in traffic on Lorain Road.

Susan Jakubowski, San Marino, commented on the aesthetics in the San Marino business districts, and suggested that slowing down the speed limits in these areas may decrease the vacancies in these business districts. Ms. Jakubowski also stated her opposition to the double turn lanes on San Marino Avenue. She suggested establishing a grassroots consortium of city representatives to address these traffic calming issues.


Traffic Commissioner Calvin Lo suggested a joint meeting with neighboring cities to address the bigger traffic issues.

Stephanie Johnson, San Marino, commented that the City needs to stay engaged with Metro.

Councilman Allan Yung requested that staff look at the "No Right Turn on Red" sign at Huntington and Del Mar to make sure it is properly posted and visible.
