NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the General Municipal Election is to be held in the City of San Marino on Tuesday, November 5, 2019, at which there will be submitted to the voters the following Measure:


Shall an ordinance be adopted to continue the Special Public Safety Tax for Paramedic Services, Fire Protection and Prevention and Police Protection in the City of San Marino providing approximately \$3,400,000 annually, until 2025?	YES _____	NO _____

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that pursuant to Article 4, Chapter 3, Division 9 of the Elections Code of the State of California, the legislative body of the City, or any member or members thereof authorized by the body, or any individual voter or bona fide association of citizens, or any combination of voters and associations, may file a written argument for or against a city measure, not exceeding 300 words in length, or rebuttal argument, not exceeding 250 words in length. Arguments and rebuttals shall be submitted to the City Clerk, at City Hall, 2200 Huntington Drive, San Marino, California, accompanied by the printed names(s) and signature(s) of the author(s) submitting it, or if submitted on behalf of an organization, the name of the organization, and the printed name and signature of at least one of its principal officers who is the author of the argument. Arguments may be changed or withdrawn until and including the date fixed by the City Clerk.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that, based upon the time reasonably necessary to prepare and print the written arguments and sample ballots for the election, the City Clerk has fixed **Friday, July 12, 2019**, during normal office hours, as posted, as the date after which no written arguments for or against the city measure may be submitted to the City Clerk for printing and distribution to the voters as provided in Article 4.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that any ordinance, impartial analysis, or direct argument filed under the authority of the elections code will be available for public examination in the City Clerk's Office for not less than 10-calendar days from the deadline for the filing of the arguments and analysis.
