

April 2010 Clear Messages – Burglaries

Dear CLEAR Subscriber:

In a CLEAR message sent to you on April 1, 2010, you were provided information recommending a heightened state of awareness due to large numbers of criminals being released back onto the streets of Los Angeles County. While we cannot know all of the crimes these individuals may be responsible for it is reasonable that there could be a correlation between these releases and recent increases in criminal activity.

On Thursday, **April 15, 2010**, a family living in a home on the **1400 block of San Gabriel Boulevard** left their residence at noon and returned four hours later to find their home burglarized. An unknown suspect(s) had gained access to their residence through a dog door. Suspect(s) ransacked the residence and removed property.

On Saturday, **April 17, 2010**, two male Hispanics jumped a fence to gain entry into the rear yard of a home in the **1800 block of St. Albans**. A 16 year old resident of the home confronted the two subjects in the back yard who told her they were looking for Johnny. This information was not provided to the Police Department until two hours after the incident.

Later that same day a resident in the **2400 block of Roanoke** called to report two male Hispanics knocking at her front door. When she responded the subjects asked if "Joshua" was at the location. The resident called the police for assistance because the subject appeared suspicious. Officers believing these were the same subjects on the earlier St. Albans incident stopped and detained the subjects in the 2200 blk. Roanoke. The resident from St. Albans identified the subjects as being the same that had entered their backyard. A 19 year old male from Los Angeles and a 17 year old male from Maywood were arrested.

On Monday, April 19th there was an attempted vehicle burglary in the **900 block of Huntington Drive**. The victim parked her car to the rear of a business at that location and was away from her vehicle for only 15 minutes. When she returned,

she discovered that unknown suspect(s) had smashed the window of the vehicle, but failed to gain entry.

That same day police were summoned to a home in the **2100 block of Roanoke Road** where suspects had removed property from an unlocked vehicle.

This information is being provided so that you are aware of what is going on in our community and so you can be on the lookout.
