For the period of Sunday, October 28, 2018, through Saturday, November 3, 2018, the Police Department responded to 538 calls for service. No residential burglaries and No attempt residential burglary occurred during the reporting week. The following is a summary report of the key incidents handled by the Department during this reporting period.

**Sunday, October 28, 2018**

**Monday, October 29, 2018**

**9:40 A.M. - FATAL TRAFFIC COLLISION / LORAIN ROAD & WINDSOR ROAD:** SMPD Officers were dispatched to the above intersection reference a report of an injury traffic collision with unknown injuries. SMPD Officers arrived to the above location and confirmed a vehicle had collided into a tree and a parked vehicle and the driver was trapped inside the vehicle. San Marino Fire and Alhambra Fire responded to the scene and extricated P1. P1 was transported to a local hospital where she succumbed to her injuries. Pasadena's Traffic Collision Investigation Team responded to assist with mapping the collision scene.

**1:31 P.M. - OSJ / WARRANT / ARREST / HUNTINGTON DRIVE:** SMPD Officer arrived at the above location and contacted S/ Frank Anthony Aliano. A records check of S/Aliano revealed an outstanding warrant in the amount of \$20,000 from Pasadena PD and they advised us to issue an O/R citation. S/Aliano was arrested, issued an O/R citation, and released at the scene.

**4:34 P.M. - P.C 530.5 / IDENTITY THEFT / CHAUCER ROAD:** Victim stated they received a text message from Life Lock regarding an account from Flex Shopper was going into collection due to a past due bill. Victim stated they never opened up an account with Flex Shopper.
