

July 14, 2019 thru July 20, 2019	Calls for Service 729	Residential Burglaries 1
Total Year to Date for 2019	16,443	34

For the period of Sunday, July 14, 2019, through Saturday, July 20, 2019, the Police Department responded to 729 calls for service. One residential burglary and no attempt residential burglaries occurred during the reporting week. The following is a summary report of the key incidents handled by the Department during this reporting period.

Sunday, July 14, 2019

2:29 P.M. – INCIDENT REPORT / 500 BLOCK LOS ARBOLES LANE: SMPD Officer's arrived to the above location for a male subject, possibly attempting to gain access to the construction site. SMPD Officers contacted the homeowner. The owner said a white van was parked in front of the residence and a male subject was sitting in the passenger seat. Another male subject was standing near the locked gate while removing something from a bag he was carrying. The owner confronted the subject who then ran back to the van and fled westbound on California. The male was described as Hispanic, wearing a black shirt and pants, black gloves and a black baseball cap. The owner got a picture of the subject and the rear of the vehicle. The vehicle's license plate returned to an address out of Monterey Park.

6:35 P.M. – VEHICLE STORAGE / SAN GABRIEL BLVD. & SHEFFIELD: Driver was stopped for a moving violation. License plate was under the paper plates. Vehicle registration came back expired since Jan 2019. Vehicle was stored for CVC 22651(o)(1).

Monday, July 15, 2019

7:42 A.M. – CVC 14601.1(a)/SUSPENDED LICENSE / MONTEREY ROAD & OXFORD ROAD: SMPD Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle with expired vehicle registration. A check of the driver revealed his license was suspended. He was issued an O/R citation and released. His vehicle was stored.

9:04 A.M. – PC 487(a)/GRAND THEFT / 1400 BLOCK BELLWOOD: RP from 2000 Block of Del Mar Ave dropped off items which were located in her yard. The items appeared to be female cosmetics and other various items consistent from a ladies purse. SMPD Officer was able to locate the owner of the property based on a business card. The owner stated she left her purse on her driveway on 07/09/19 at approximately 2030 hours. She looked for it the next morning and discovered it missing. All contents except the purse itself was recovered.

10:41 A.M. – PC 476/FORGERY & PC 4573/CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE IN JAIL & WARRANT / ARREST / 900 BLOCK HUNTINGTON DRIVE: An employee at the above location called to report a subject inside the bank was attempting to negotiate a fraudulent check. SMPD Officers arrived and detained the suspect (UNDERHILL, Steven), (39), (Alhambra, CA). Employee and victim statements confirm the subject was negotiating a fabricated check using the victim's account information. Suspect was arrested for the above and also found to have an outstanding misdemeanor warrant out of Glendora PD in the amount of \$30,000.00 for CVC 12500(a). He was transported to Alhambra Jail where a baggie of white crystalline substance was located in his right front coin pocket of his pants. He was also charged for PC 4573.

Tuesday, July 16, 2019

1:28 P.M. – FOUND PROPERTY / HUNTINGTON DRIVE: SMPD Officer was given a set of keys which were turned into City Hall. An unknown subject turned the keys into the Recreation department on 07/11/19 only stating they were found on Huntington Drive. There was nothing on the set of keys indicating ownership.

SMPD Officer spoke to Subject, who stated he found a razor blade in the sidewall of his tire today. He said earlier in the morning, he found a broken glass bottle in the gutter in front of his house. He also said he located a plastic bag in his front yard which contained dog feces on 07/14/19. He does not know how these incidents occurred or who would have done them.

Department received an Adult Protective Services report. The report alleged the victim was forced to sign checks to his daughter. Victim's wife was contacted and she stated she has power of attorney over her husband do to his medical condition. She said the checks were written for victim's medical treatment and were legitimate. Her daughter had victim sign the checks because she was not available. The allegations are unfounded.

4:32 P.M. - PC 459 / RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY / 1400 BLOCK SAN MARINO AVENUE: SMPD Officers were dispatched to the above location for a burglary investigation. SMPD Officers arrived on scene and contacted the resident. Resident stated his house has been under construction for the past nine months. He was going to install an 80" television today and found it missing. He said the television was delivered a couple weeks ago and was never removed from the factory box. Resident said the last time he saw the television was on Saturday 7/13 at 1600hrs. He returned to the location on Monday, 7/15 to continue work. When entering the house from the front door, he noticed the "peephole" door was open. He didn't think much of it and continued working. He only noticed the television was missing today.
