

<b>December 30, 2018 thru January 5, 2019</b>	<b>Calls for Service 687</b>	<b>Residential Burglaries 2</b>
<b>Total Year to Date for 2019</b>	<b>687</b>	<b>2</b>

For the period of Sunday, December 30, 2018, through Saturday, January 5, 2019, the Police Department responded to 687 calls for service. Two residential burglaries and No attempt residential burglary occurred during the reporting week. The following is a summary report of the key incidents handled by the Department during this reporting period.

**Sunday, December 30, 2018**

**5:31 A.M. - CRITICAL MISSING PERSON / ORLANDO ROAD:** SMPD received notification of a missing person from the above location. SMPD was able to locate the MP with the help of Industry Sheriff's Department. MP was contacted and detained by the Sheriff's for a 5150 hold. MP was removed from the MPS.

**1:23 P.M. - PC 484 / PACKAGE THEFT / CUMBERLAND ROAD:** SMPD Officer arrived to the above location and contacted victim. Victim stated they ordered a package which was delivered by UPS on 12/27/18. When victim went to pick up the package, it was missing.

**Monday, December 31, 2018**

**4:03 P.M. - P.C. 459 / RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY / PASQUALITO DRIVE:** Victim stated one outdoor speaker and one sub-woofer were taken from her garage.

**Wednesday, January 2, 2019**

**12:53 P.M. - P.C. 459 / RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY / CANTERBURY ROAD:** SMPD Officers were dispatched to the area of Canterbury Road and San Marino Avenue on a report of a suspicious occupied vehicle. A corrected location was later given as Canterbury Road between Santa Anita Avenue and Palomar Road for an older model gray Honda occupied by 3 male African-Americans, two of which were wearing masks.

Officers arrived in the area and began to look for the vehicle. An SMPD Officer saw a vehicle matching the description and attempted a traffic stop. The vehicle stopped on San Gabriel Blvd., northbound, north of California Blvd. and the three occupants jumped out of the moving vehicle

and fled on foot. A containment was set up and Officers were assisted by Pasadena PD, San Gabriel PD, and South Pasadena Officers. While Officers were conducting a search for the outstanding suspects, one suspect emerged from a detached guest house to the rear of the property on the 2600 block of San Pasqual. The suspect, in an attempt to hide from officers entered the guest house from a window that was found open. The suspect in custody was identified as Andrew Thomas Kelley (18) of Upland, or a second address in Altadena. S/Kelley was transported to Alhambra jail for booking and housing. Pasadena Crime Techs responded and processed both scenes for evidence. The Crime Techs later responded to the station and processed the suspect vehicle for evidence.

**4:26 P.M. - 901T / INJURY / TRAFFIC COLLISION / PCD /HUNTINGTON DRIVE & WEST DRIVE:** P1 and P2 were involved in the above. Both parties were transported to local hospitals for treatment.

**8:10 P.M. - PC 484 – PACKAGE THEFT / MISSION STREET:** SMPD Officer arrived to the above location regarding a package theft investigation. A package was delivered via FedEx and at approximately 1502 hours, the suspect walked up to the front porch, took the package, and left the location on foot. The resident had video surveillance of the suspect and it was provided to the officer by the victim.

**8: 38 P.M. – BARKING DOG / SIERRA MADRE BLVD:** Officer observed the barking dog for 15 minutes and found the dog to be barking in violation of the San Marino City Code. Officer was unable to make contact with the resident and a business card was left at the location.

**Thursday, January 3, 2019**

**10:02 A.M. – DEATH INVESTIGATION / ADAIR STREET:** SMPD received a 9-1-1 call regarding an elderly female who was unconscious and not breathing. SMFD was also present and confirmed she had been deceased for at least one hour. Officer contacted the deceased's doctor who agreed to sign the death certificate.

**2:19 P.M. - PC 530.5(a) – IDENTITY THEFT / OXFORD ROAD:** Victim came into the SMPD lobby and advised she received an email from Apple stating there was a charge on her credit card account. Victim did not authorize any charges and contested the charge. There was no unusual activity on her card and there was no loss at the time of this report.

**5:39 P.M. – INCIDENT REPORT / WIC 5150 / HUNTINGTON DRIVE & SAN GABRIEL BLVD:** SMPD Officer observed a vehicle smoking and stopped in the #4 lane of E/B Huntington Drive east of San Gabriel Blvd. While contacting the driver, it appeared the smoke was from excessive braking or use of the clutch. The driver, appeared possibly disoriented or suffering from a medical complication. SMFD responded and attempted to get vitals. During this time, was uncooperative with the Officer and Paramedics. Based on her behavior, altered mental state, and her statements, she was deemed a danger to herself and placed on a WIC 5150 hold and transported to a medical facility for follow up care.

**Friday, January 4, 2019**

**3:02 A.M. - VC 14601.1(a) / SUSPENDED LICENSE / MONTEREY & HUNTINGTON DRIVE:** SMPD Officer observed a motorcycle run a red light and then go into a locked two-wheel skid. Officer conducted a traffic enforcement stop and contacted the rider. The rider, FELIPE TORRES, Alhambra, was found to have a suspended license and two outstanding misdemeanor warrants for VC 14601.1(a) from Pasadena and South Pasadena. TORRES was issued an O/R citation and released into the custody of the South Pasadena Police Department for their warrant.

**10:18 A.M. - PC 484 / AUTO THEFT / CARLARIS:** SMPD Officers arrived at the above location for a theft from vehicle investigation. Officers contacted the victim who said his truck was parked in front of the location while he worked in the rear yard. When he came to the front yard, a neighbor informed him two M/H's removed items from his truck. The suspect vehicle was described as a silver Toyota Tundra. A nearby resident provided video of the crime. Total loss was a leaf blower.

**11:26 A.M. – 902T / NON-INJURY / TRAFFIC COLLISION / HUTNINGTON & WEST:** P1 and P2 were involved in the above.

**1:08 P.M. – PC 484g / FRAUDULENT USE OF ACCESS CARD / BEDFORD ROAD:** Victim came into the SMPD lobby to report unknown suspect(s) made multiple purchases on her Bank of China credit card. Victim called her bank to cancel the card. The charges were made online in London, Madrid, and Luton.

**5:11 P.M. – ESCARS / SUSPECTED CHILD ABUSE / CHARLTON ROAD:** SMPD conducted an investigation and was unable to make contact with the parent. Additional follow up will be conducted later.
