

<b>May 19, 2019 thru May 25, 2019</b>	<b>Calls for Service 572</b>	<b>Residential Burglaries 1</b>
<b>Total Year to Date for 2019</b>	<b>11,370</b>	<b>28</b>

For the period of Sunday, May 19, 2019, through Saturday, May 25, 2019, the Police Department responded to 572 calls for service. One residential burglary and no attempt residential burglaries occurred during the reporting week. The following is a summary report of the key incidents handled by the Department during this reporting period.

### **Sunday, May 19, 2019**

**6:17 P.M. - PC 459 / RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY / 1800 BLOCK LOS ROBLES AVENUE:** SMPD Dispatch received a report of an audible burglary alarm at 1817 hours. SMPD Officers arrived on scene and observed a north facing side door ajar with no force. SMPD Officers cleared the residence and found a rear French door window pane shattered (POE). Unknown suspect(s) removed two drawers from the victim's bedroom. Loss is unknown at this time.

**7:27 P.M. - CVC 20002(A) / HIT & RUN / 900 BLOCK KEWEN DRIVE:** An unknown female adult driving a dark colored BMW 550i sedan with a rear Pacific Auto paper plate struck the driver's side of the victims vehicle (2007 Toyota Prius Gray). The driver side rearview mirror was damaged as well as scuff marks and dents were located on the driver's door.

### **Monday, May 20, 2019**

**10:06 A.M. - FOUND PROPERTY / CHARLTON ROAD:** SMPD Officers arrived to the above location and contacted RP. The RP located a drone on her driveway at approximately 1515 hours yesterday. The drone appeared to be an inexpensive child's toy with no camera. No owner was located.

**4:40 P.M. - CVC 22651(o)(1)(1) / VEHICLE STORAGE / 2500 BLOCK HUNTINGTON DRIVE:** SMPD Cadet located a vehicle parked in front of the above location with expired stickers since 01/17 and had 5 delinquent parking violations. R/O was contacted at the scene.

**6:37 P.M. - C.V.C. 20002(a) / HIT AND RUN / 2100 BLOCK SHERWOOD ROAD:** SMPD Officer was dispatched to the above address reference a report of a hit and run without injuries. SMPD Officer arrived at approximately 1842 hours and contacted the RP who stated a large motorhome backed up into his parked vehicle causing front hood damage.

**Tuesday, May 21, 2019**

**8:50 A.M. - WARRANT / EXPIRED REGISTRATION / HUNTINGTON DRIVE & GAINSBOROUGH:** SMPD Officers conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle with no license plates. During the contact, the driver Holloman, Margarita (50), (Palmdale, CA) had a warrant in the amount of \$300.00 out of LASD Palmdale. Further investigation determined, the vehicle stickers had been expired since April 2017. S/Holloman was issued a citation for the warrant and for driving on a suspended license. Her vehicle was stored for expired more than 6 months.

**10:07 A.M. - FOUND PROPERTY / ROBLES & WINSTON:** SMPD Officers located a white 24 speed mountain bike in the bushes adjacent to the wash, next to the high school. The bike was taken for safe keeping. The high school was notified in case it was a student's bike.

**10:55 A.M. - INCIDENT REPORT / 1600 BLOCK HUNTINGTON DRIVE:** RP reported that he received a threatening text message from an old friend of his who is living in Kansas. The RP reported an old friend asked him and another friend for money, via a group text. Both parties initially stated they would not give him money. Moments later the subject responded by saying he was going to thank both of them in person. No direct threat was made.

**1:42 P.M. - PC 602 / TRESPASS / 2200 BLOCK ASHBOURNE:** RP reported seeing a male Caucasian climb the fence of a house that is under construction. SMPD Officers responded and found S/Siljeg, Skylar (25), (Transient) in the house. SMPD Officers contacted the homeowner, who desired prosecution. S/Siljeg was transported to Alhambra Jail for booking and was later cited out.

**3:29 P.M. - 2000I / HIT AND RUN / HUNTINGTON DRIVE & SAN MARINO:** Victim (juvenile) stated he was crossing south on San Marino Ave from the N/W corner of Huntington and San Marino. As he stepped off the curb on a green light, a white car (NFD) made a right turn from southbound San Marino onto WB Huntington Drive, striking his left knee. The vehicle continued WB on Huntington Drive. The victim does not believe the vehicle knew he struck him. The juvenile's mother was contacted and did not desire prosecution or medical attention.

**Wednesday, May 22, 2019**

**8:42 P.M. - INCIDENT REPORT | 2200 BLOCK MELVILLE AVENUE:** The San Marino Police Department received a 911 call regarding a verbal argument between a husband and a wife at the above location. While speaking with both parties, the allegations of a physical altercation were unfounded. DCFS was contacted and a report was generated.

**Thursday, May 23, 2019**

**8:07 A.M. – 902T / NON-INJURY / TRAFFIC COLLISION / ROBLES & SIERRA MADRE:** SMPD Officers were dispatched to the location at 0807hrs for a hit-and-run traffic collision. SMPD Officers arrived on scene at 0809hrs and contacted both parties involved. (PI) failed to yield to northbound Sierra Madre traffic and caused the collision. Both vehicles involved sustained moderate damage and were towed from the scene. PI drove home around the block but returned as officers arrived on scene.

**12:07 P.M. – PC 653M / ANNOYING PHONE CALLS:** SMPD Officer was dispatched to the station lobby for an annoying phone calls investigation. SMPD Officer contacted the victim. Victim said she has been receiving several calls from an unknown male caller over the past couple months. Victim said she would just hang up on the caller each time he called. Today, the suspect texted her an explicit photo and made sexual remarks towards her. She does not know who the suspect is and desires prosecution.

**8:28 A.M. – PC 594 / VANDALISM / EL MOLINO & WILSON:** SMPD Officers were dispatched to the police lobby for the above investigation. Officer contacted the victim who stated an unknown suspect threw an object at her vehicle's windshield as she drove in the area at approximately 0820hrs. The male suspect yelled at her as he threw the object. Victim said the suspect then picked up the item he threw and fled the area in a white or silver Ford F150 truck. The suspect was described as an M/W, 5'06" – 5'09" tall, with white hair (NFD).

**3:22 P.M. – PC 459 / VEHICLE BURGLARY / 900 BLOCK KEWEN DRIVE:** Victim parked her vehicle in front of the above location at 1430hrs. She went inside the location to work. Victim returned to her vehicle at 1515hrs and noticed her passenger side window was shattered and her purse was missing from the passenger floorboard. Reviewing video of the incident, a white vehicle drove by victim's vehicle. An M/B or M/H exited the rear passenger seat. The suspect walked over to the victim's vehicle and smashed the window with an unknown object. The suspect removed the purse and re-entered the white vehicle. The vehicle fled the location. Suspect is observed to be either an M/B or M/H, approximately 25 years of age, wearing black clothing, and a black baseball cap with a red bill. The vehicle appears to be a Toyota Camry. These plates were reported stolen on 05/20/2019.

**Friday, May 24, 2019**

**7:36 A.M. – FALL ON CITY PROPERTY / GRANADA & AFTON:** SMPD Officer were dispatched to the area at 0736 for an aggressive coyote who chased a women and her dog. Officer arrived and contacted the victim. Victim said she was walking her small dog in the area when a coyote started chasing her. She ran away from the coyote fearing for her dog's safety. She fell onto the street as she ran away. Victim sustained a small scrape to her right leg. Photographs were taken of her injury and the immediate area.

**11:43 A.M. – PC 530.5 / IDENTITY THEFT / 2200 BLOCK CONSITON:** SMPD Officers were dispatched to the station lobby regarding the above. SMPD Officers contacted the victim. Victim said she was notified by her bank (Bank of America) about possible fraudulent activity on her account. She went to the bank and noticed several transactions that she did not make or authorize. It is unknown how the unknown suspect(s) gained access to her account.

**Saturday May 25, 2019**

**10:04 A.M. – PC 275.5 / DOMESTIC BATTERY / (ARREST) / 2100 BLOCK HUNTINGTON DRIVE:** SMPD Officers were dispatched to the above location at 1004hrs for a male subject hitting a female subject inside a vehicle. Officers arrived and the vehicle had just left the location. SMPD Officers checked the area and observed the vehicle on Lorain Road and Virginia Road. A traffic stop was conducted and both occupants were contacted. It was determined the male driver and female passenger got into a verbal argument. The driver, Xiao Li (36), (Alhambra, CA), pulled over in front of the above location and starting choking his girlfriend. She attempted to get out of the vehicle but he prevented her from exiting for several minutes. They eventually drove away before being contacted by SMPD. A records check returned with S/Li with having a \$40,000 warrant out of Azusa for battery and false imprisonment. He was arrested on all listed charges and transported to the Alhambra Jail for booking. S/Li later bonded out and was released. An EPO was requested and approved by a judge. He was served with the EPO before being released.

**5:16 P.M. – PC 530.5 / IDENTITY THEFT / 2900 BLOCK HUNTINGTON DRIVE:** SMPD Officer was dispatched to the station lobby for this investigation. SMPD Officer arrived on scene and contacted the victim. Victim stated she runs a non-profit organization. She stated unknown suspect(s) hacked into her email account and sent an email to the treasurer of the non-profit requesting money. It is unknown at this time if any money was sent. The investigation is currently on-going.
