For the period of Sunday, April 12, 2020 through Saturday, April 18, 2020, the Police Department responded to 406 calls for service. Three residential burglaries, one commercial burglary, and zero attempt residential burglaries occurred during the reporting week. The following is a summary report of the key incidents handled by the Department during this reporting period.
