For the period of Sunday, April 19, 2020 through Saturday, April 25, 2020, the Police Department responded to 430 calls for service. Two residential burglaries, zero commercial burglary, and zero attempt residential burglaries occurred during the reporting week. The following is a summary report of the key incidents handled by the Department during this reporting period.
