For the period of Sunday, April 26, 2020 through Saturday, May 2, 2020, the Police Department responded to 431 calls for service. Zero residential burglaries, zero commercial burglary, and zero attempt residential burglaries occurred during the reporting week. The following is a summary report of the key incidents handled by the Department during this reporting period.

Sunday, April 26, 2020
