For the period of Sunday, July 19, 2020 through Saturday, July 25, 2020, the Police Department responded to 356 calls for service. One residential burglary, Zero commercial burglaries, and one attempt residential burglary occurred during the reporting week. The following is a summary report of the key incidents handled by the Department during this reporting period.

**Sunday, July 19, 2020**

**6:51 P.M. / PC 459 / VEHICLE BURGLARY / EUSTON ROAD / VIRGINIA ROAD:** Unknown suspect(s) smashed the rear passenger side window and took multiple bags and miscellaneous items.

**Monday, July 20, 2020**

**8:30 A.M. / PC 594 / VADALISM / 2700 BLOCK OF CALIFORNIA BOULEVARD:** Unknown suspect(s) vandalized the driveway gate to the property.

Upon further investigation, officers located a solo vehicle collision and located the driver, Gomez Escalante, Jose Eliseo (3/15/1998, Los Angeles) who was determined to be driving while under the influence of alcohol. Gomez was transported to Pasadena Jail for booking, where he spit at officers and began to resist arrest.
