For the period of Sunday, May 31, 2020 through Saturday, June 6, 2020, the Police Department responded to 685 calls for service. Zero residential burglary, one commercial burglaries, and zero attempt residential burglaries occurred during the reporting week. The following is a summary report of the key incidents handled by the Department during this reporting period.

Sunday, May 31, 2020

12:41 A.M. / PC 148 / RESISTING OFFICER / 800 BLOCK OF SIERRA MADRE BOULEVARD: Officers responded to the listed location, regarding a male subject walking on the roadway. Upon arrival, officers observed the subject walking in lanes and ordered the subject to get off the street. Smith, Christopher (DOB 1/13/78) refused orders and continued to walk on the street. To prevent Smith from being hit by a car, officers held Smith and led him to the sidewalk; Smith began to physical resist officers. Smith was issued an own recognizance citation and released in the field without further incident.
